

# Stop the Brutal Suppression of Falun Gong in China!

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Practicing Falun Gong Was A Right, Ms. Chen Said, Up To Her Last Day

The day before Chen Zixiu died, her captors again demanded that she renounce her faith in Falun Dafa. Barely conscious after repeated jolts from a cattle prod, the 58-year-old stubbornly shook her head.

Enraged, the local officials ordered Ms. Chen to run barefoot in the snow. Two days of torture had left her legs bruised and her short black hair matted with pus and blood, said cellmates and other prisoners who witnessed the incident. She crawled outside, vomited and collapsed. She never regained consciousness, and died on Feb. 21...

In July of 1999, the Chinese government officially banned FALUN GONG, a peaceful spiritual faith. Since that time, a tide of mass arrests and police brutality has swept the nation. Tens of thousands of practitioners of Falun Gong are currently in police detention, thousands more in labor reform camps. Several hundred have been sentenced to harsh prison terms in cursory show trials. Many sane and healthy practitioners have been shut away in psychiatric hospitals and forcibly given injections of drugs that damage the nervous system. Others have faced huge fines, loss of jobs, expulsion from schools, public humiliation, and severe torture. At least 48 Falun Gong practitioners have died in police custody since the crackdown began.

And yet Falun Gong practitioners continue to go to Tiananmen Square every day, peacefully but persistently protesting the government crackdown. There they are inevitably beaten down and taken off to detention centers where they face interrogation and torture. And still they keep going back. Why? Because this is the only way they have to show their government that Falun Gong is not a 'cult,' as the government has charged, but a legitimate and worthy spiritual discipline. Since the Chinese Communist Party is strictly atheist, many kinds of qigong, traditional practices, and underground Protestant and Catholic churches are also considered 'evil cults' in China.

Despite the suppression by the Chinese government, Falun Gong practitioners – students, retirees, workers, scholars, officials – still strive to follow the principles of Falun Gong: Truthfulness, Compassion, and Forbearance. No matter where they are, they endure silently and bear no hatred in their hearts. In the prisons, their great tolerance and kindness have sometimes even moved many hardened criminals to change their ways.
